



Death of Mr. Thomas Strange Brown

We regret to record the somewhat sudden death of Mr. Thomas Strane Brown (brother of Mr. W. Brown, of West Street), which took place at his residence, Manor Farm, Frilsham Hermitage, on Wednesday the 14th instant. The deceased gentleman had been in indifferent health for some time past, and the greatest sympathy is felt for his widow and family. He was a member of an old and well known family of agriculturalists in Wiltshire, and formerly resided at Kennett. The interment took place at Aldbourne, on Monday in last week, and was attended by a large circle of relations and friends of the deceased. Blinds were drawn on the route, and every respect was shown as the solemn procession wended its way to and from the churchyard. The Rev. G. Floyd, of Frilsham, officiated, assisted by the Vicar of Aldbourne. The mourners were:-
