Aldbourne



Aldbourne is a village and parish, in the Northern division of the county, hundred of Selkley, Hungerford union and county court district, diocese of Salisbury, archdeaconry of Wilts, and rural deanery of Marlborough; it is pleasantly situated in a fertile valley, 8 miles north-west from Hungerford station, 68 miles from London, 9 south-west from Swindon, and 7 north-east from Marlborough. The church of St. Michael is an ancient structure, in the Norman style, and has a nave, two aisles, two chancel aisles, porch, square tower and 8 bells. The register dates from 1637. The living is a vicarage, yearly value £365, with residence, in the gift of the Bishop of Salisbury, and held by the Rev. George Parker Cleather, M.A., of Exeter College, Oxford. There is a National school, a Gothic stone building; also places of worship for Calvinists, Wesleyans and Primitive Methodists. H. D. Francis, Esq., is lord of the manor. The principal landowner is Walter M. Baskerville, Esq. The soil is light; subsoil, chalky. The chief crops are barley and roots. The area is 8,495 acres, and the population in 1861 was 1,539.
