



Horticultural Tales *Alderbury 1800-1849*

1821

An apple measuring 13 $\frac{3}{4}$ inches in circumference, and weighing 1lb and 1oz has been gathered from a tree belonging to Mrs. Collins, of Alderbury, near this city. The apple is of the sort called the Prophet, and the tree was grafted only three years ago. All the fruit on the tree (about half a sack full) was very large, some nearly the size of the above. **Salisbury and Winchester Journal Monday 22 October 1821**

1825

In the garden of Mr. Doughty, of Alderbury, a barley-corn has produced 95 ears, with 2172 grains. **Salisbury and Winchester Journal Monday 19 September 1825**
