

The Recent Storm Damage

On Monday afternoon a heavy storm passed over this city [Salisbury] and the neighbourhood. It swept over Homington, at which place a staddle barn belonging to Mr. J. Brown was blown down, and several men who were at work therein with a hand thrashing machine were buried beneath the debris.

One man was so badly bruised as to necessitate his removal to the Salisbury Infirmary. Trees were torn up by the roots, the front wall of the cottage was blown down, and scarcely a roof in the village escaped damage. The storm, or as it has been described by some, - the whirlwind - passed in the direction of Clarendon, where the barns and other farm buildings of Mr. Maton sustained considerable damage, and a man named John Collins was seriously injured. He was removed to the Salisbury Infirmary.
