Alderton



ALDERTON, a township, village, and parish, in Chippenham hundred and Malmesbury union, North Wilts, diocese of Gloucester and Bristol, 9 miles north-west from Chippenham, and 7½ south-west from Malmesbury. The living is a perpetual curacy, values at £80, and in the presentation of Sir John Neeld, who is lord of the manor; the Rev. Arthur Atherley, M.A., is the incumbent. The church of St. Giles underwent considerable repairs about 1845, and a spire has been added. Here is a school for boys and girls, supported by J. Neeld, Esq. The area of the parish is 1,600 acres, and the population 182.

DUNLEY is 1½ mile south-east.

POST OFFICE - Ann Watts, postmistress. Letters through Chippenham at 10.15 a.m.; dispatched at 4 p.m. The nearest money order office is at Malmesbury.
