1809

Lately died at Alvediston, Mr. William Bowles, aged 84 years, greatly beloved and respected. Salisbury and Winchester Journal, Monday, 27 February 1809

1811

Aged 69, Mr. King, of Alvediston, Wilts., one of the most extensive and experienced agriculturists in the West of England. Hampshire Chronicle, Monday, 2 December 1811

1818

A few days since, died, Thomas Lawes, Esq., of Alvediston, in this county, at the advanced age of 88 years. **Salisbury and Winchester Journal, Monday, 16 March 1818**

1819

Monday last was married at Alvediston, Mr. Henry Lush, of Sixpenny Handley, to Miss Maria Green, of the same place. Salisbury and Winchester Journal, Monday, 29 November 1819

1825

On the same day (Tuesday last) after a long and painful illness, Thomas King, esq., of Alvediston. Mr. King, we believe, was one of the most opulent farmers in England, and his benevolence kept pace with his wealth. His possessions were the region of hospitality, and his house was its home. Every class of society, within a large circuit, will deeply regret the loss of this excellent man. **Devizes and Wiltshire Gazette Thursday 22 September 1825**

1827

On Wednesday the 17th inst died at Bower Chalk, in her 81st year, Mrs. King, relict of Thomas King, Esq., formerly of Alvediston. Salisbury and Winchester Journal, Monday, 22 October 1827

1831

April 4 at Tisbury, Mr. John Furnell, to Miss Ann Young, youngest daughter of the late Mr. Jos. Young, of Alvediston Bath Chronicle and Weekly Gazette, Thursday, 14 April 1831

1834

Married, at the Parish Church of Alvediston, on Thursday, January 30, by the Rev. J. F. Witty, Mr. Hayward, of Binegar, Somerset, to Miss Rogers, of the former place. **Salisbury and Winchester Journal, Monday, 3 February 1834**

Married, on Wednesday last, at Coombe Bassett, by the Rev. Mr. Shrabb, Mr. John Harris, boot and shoe maker, of Coombe, to Miss Ann Poole, of Alvediston, both in this county. **Salisbury and Winchester Journal Monday 27 October 1834**

Died on Friday last, Thomas, the infant son of Thomas King, Esq., of Alvediston, Wilts, aged seven months. Salisbury and Winchester Journal, Monday, 8 December 1834

1840

On Monday, June 3, at Broad Chalk, by the Rev. A. Chapman, Mr Jacob King, keeper to T King, Esq., of Alvediston, to Miss Ann Scammell, eldest daughter of Mr John Scammell, of the same place. Salisbury and Winchester Journal, Monday, 8 June 1840

1841

Married, on Friday, February 5, at St. James's Church, Poole, by the Rev. Mr. Oshey, Mr. Thomas Ellis, of Alvediston, to Miss S. Rebbeck, of Wyvesborne. Salisbury and Winchester Journal, Monday, 22 February 1841

Died , on Thursday, the 16th inst., Edward Tanner, infant son of Mr. J. W. G. Rogers, of Alvediston. Salisbury and Winchester Journal, Monday, 20 December 1841

1843

Died, June 16, at Alvedistone, Mrs. Mary Rebbeck, aged 66 years. Salisbury and Winchester Journal, 20 June 1843

1844

Died, at Alvediston, on Friday, December 29, in his 70th year, William Mullins, many years a faithful servant of the late Thomas King, Esq. **Salisbury and Winchester Journal, Saturday, 8 January 1844**

1845

Died, on Tuesday, December 21, in his ninetieth year, Mr. Rogers, of Alvediston, in this county. Salisbury and Winchester Journal, Saturday, 4 January 1845

Died, on the 14th inst., at Alvediston, Susannah, relict of Mr. James Rebbeck, of Ebbesborne, aged 82. Salisbury and Winchester Journal, Saturday, 15 March 1845
