



Amesbury Fatal Accident of William Weston

(Appeared in the Salisbury and Winchester Journal Saturday 16th November 1872)

Fatal Accident. - An inquest was held by Mr.R.M. Wilson, coroner, at the Old Castle house on Monday last, on the body of William Weston, aged 47 years, of Amesbury, a labourer in the employ of Mr. Hayes of the King's Arms Inn, who was accidentally killed on Saturday afternoon near old castle.

The deceased was returning to Amesbury, about 4 o'clock, in charge of a wagon on the shafts of which he was riding, and from which he fell, dislocating his neck, and also receiving other injuries to his face and head from the effects of which he instantly died. He was perfectly sober at the time and there was no evidence to account for his falling from the shafts.

The jury returned a verdict of "Accidental Death".
