

Post Office Directory Extract 1875 **Atworth**



Atworth (or Atford) is a tithing, in the parish, hundred and union of Bradford, Northern division of the county, Melksham county court district, diocese of Sarum, archdeaconry of Wilts, and rural deanery of Potterne, 4 miles north-east from Bradford, 3 south from Corsham station, and 101 from London, situated on the high road from London to Bath and Bristol. For ecclesiastical purposes the chapelry is united to the adjoining chapelry of South Wraxall, together forming an ecclesiastical parish.

The church was rebuilt about 1828; the ancient square tower, containing 3 bells, once attached to the old church, now stands apart to the north of the present building. The register dates from 1653. The living is a vicarage, gross yearly value £255, in the patronage of the Dean & Chapter of Bristol, and held by the Rev. William Laxton, M.A., of Trinity College, Oxford, who resides at Holt.

Here is a National school, and Independent and Baptist chapels.

Mrs. Jane Brown, widow, in the year 1700, devised £10 yearly to a mistress to educate poor children, £1 for books, £10 to the minister for catechising children, and £5 in clothing the poor.

There are several quarries of excellent stone in the neighbourhood, well adapted for building purposes.

Lord Methuen is lord of the manor. The principal landowner is George P Fuller, Esq., Corsham.

The land is chiefly in wheat and pasture. The ecclesistical parish is 2,927 acres, and population in 1871 was 964.
