United Reformed Chapel Green Street Avebury

An unusual example of a Christian chapel placed inside a prehistoric stone circle and dates back to around 1670.

The chapel was originally a Congregational Chapel

With a dwindling congregation, the chapel was eventually offered for sale in 2015; and in June 2017 purchased by the National Trust, as a space to highlight their conservation work and to engage people with the special landscapes within the World Heritage Site.

It was still closed when I visited in May 2018 and awaiting repairs to be undertaken.





Only a few memorials are to be found in the chapelyard.
