## **Barford St. Martin**



**Barford St. Martin** is a parish and village within the parliamentary borough of Wilton, in the Southern division of the county, hundred of Cawden and Cadworth, Wilton union, Salisbury county court district, diocese and archdeaconry and rural deanery of Chalke, 6 miles west-north-west from Salisbury, 3 west from Wilton, and 89 from London, on the river Nadder. The church of St. Martin is an ancient building, consisting of a chancel, nave, transepts, and square tower with 5 bells; the whole completely restored in 1843. The register dates from 1659. The living is a rectory, yearly value £577, with residence, in the gift of All Saints College, Oxford, and held by the Rev. Charles Hinxman, M.A., of Baliol College, Oxford. There is a handsome National school, built at a cost of £1,645, of which the Committee of the Privy Council contributed £488, comprising mixed and infant schools, with teachers' residence and ample playgrounds. There is a chapel for Dissenters. Nicholson's charity is of £68 yearly value, of which £30 is paid to the schoolmaster and the remainder distributed in money. The principal landowners are the Earl of Pembroke, who is lord of the manor, A. P. E. Powell, Esq., and Charles Penruddocke, Esq., J.P., D.L. The soil is principally chalk; subsoil, chalk. The area is 2,238 acres, principally arable and pasture land; gross estimated rental, £5,876; rateable value, £4,292; population in 1871 was 532.
