BURRIDGE v BURRIDGE

Daisy Burridge (formerly Brewer) petitioned for the dissolution of her marriage with Herbert Burridge on the ground, among others, that within five years respondent had undergone frequent convictions for crime, and had been sentenced in the aggregate to imprisonment for three years or upwards, and had left petitioner habitually without means of support. The parties were married on May 4, 1918, at Baverstock, Wilts, England, according to the rites of the Church of England. His Honor granted a decree nisi, returnable in six months, in favour of petitioner, for whom Mr Toose (instructed by Mr J. W. Abigail) appeared.
