Newspaper Reports

James HAYTER March, 1836

Mr Whitmarsh held an inquest on Monday last, at Hurdcott, on the body of James Hayter, an elderly man, who died from a concussion of the brain, produced by a fall occasioned by a paralytic seizure.

Verdict accordingly.

(Salisbury and Winchester Journal – Monday 7 March, 1836)

(Note: Hurdcott, a Hamlet about 1 mile south-east of Baverstock, in the county of Wilts. There is also a Hurdcott located near Winterbourne Earls, approximately 4 miles north-east of Salisbury, Wiltshire. With some newspaper articles it cannot be determined which Hurdcott is being referred to.)
