Baverstock

BAVERSTOCK with the hamlet of HURDCOTT, is a village 8 miles west from Salisbury, 5 miles west from Wilton, and 90 from London, in the Hundred of Branch and Dale, and Wilton Union, and is bounded on the south side by the river Nadder.

The living is a rectory, value £300, with 70 acres of glebe land, occupied by the Ven. Archdeacon Hony, B.D.

The church, which has been thoroughly repaired within the last seven years, is in the decorated style, with a square tower at the west end of the building, and 3 bells.

The population at the last census, including Hurdcott, was 194.

Charles Penruddock, Esq., is lord of the manor of Baverstock; Alexander Powell, Esq., lord of that of Hurdcott. The acreage of both is 1,168a. 34p.

There is a Free school, kept up by the present rector.

Letters are received through Barford St. Martin from Salisbury.
