The proceeds, amounting to 7ℓ . 10s., have been added to the funds of the Shipwrecked Mariners' Society. This valuable institution stands in need of more than usual support in consequence of the long catalogue of ships driven ashore and lives sacrificed during the frequent storms of the past winter. CONCERT

A concert was given in the School-room of this parish on Thursday last. By the kind valuable assistance of Mr Aylward and members of his talented family, and of Messrs Taylor and Hilton, of the choir of Salisbury Cathedral, a delightful selection of music was most ably performed to the high gratification of a crowded audience. At the conclusion, Archdeacon Hony, in returning thanks to the ladies and gentlemen who had given them such a treat that evening, alluded to the Shipwrecked Mariners' Society, to the funds of which the proceeds of the concert, amounting to about $8 \, L$, were to be added. He informed the company that 1786 ships had been lost on our own coats in the past year. The crews of these wrecked vessels were of course landed destitute, and immediately became the object of the society's care. The sum sent to the society in 1869, from the Salisbury district was $16 \, L$ $17 \, s$. 6 d.
