

Post Office Directory Extract 1855 Beechingstoke



Beechingstoke, a parish and village in the Swanborough Hundred, diocese of Sarum, and the division and Union of Devizes, situate 7 miles east of that town, containing 875 acres of land and a population, according to the census of 1851, of 188. The living is a rectory, value £285, with 33 acres of glebe land, in the gift of G. W. Heneage, Esq.; the present incumbent is the Rev. Edward W. Tuffnell, M.A. The church is a small structure, having a nave and chancel, but no tower: there are 2 bells. Here is a Parochial school, with a house for the teacher.
