Bemerton

Bemerton is a chapelry; St. John's church was erected in 1830; it is in the Early English style, and consists of chancel, nave, aisles, and square tower, having a turret on the north-west angle; there is 1 bell; the cost was about £3,000; it was erected by subscription as a memorial to "George Herbert"; the old church, in which he officiated, was restored in 1866, and is used for daily service.

Quidhampton is a tithing.
