Berwick Bassett

Berwick Bassett is a township and parish situated 9 miles from Swindon. 8 miles from Marlborough and 7½ from Wootton Bassett Station, and is in the Devizes Division of Wilts, Marlborough Union, Petty Sessional Division and County Court District, and Diocese of Salisbury. The Church, which is dedicated to St. Nicholas, has a register dating from 1674; and the living, a vicarage, with Winterbourne Monkton annexed, of the net yearly value of £295, including 9 acres of glebe, with residence, is in the gift of the Bishop of Salisbury. Mr. F. G. Smyth and Mr. Fred Doble are the chief landowners. Area, 1.391 acres; rateable value, £1.087; population in 1921, 92. Letters are despatched at 7.40 a.m. and 5.40 p.m. Weekdays, and 5.30 p.m. Sundays. The nearest Money Order and Telegraph Offices are situated at Broad Hinton and Avebury.
