

Post Office Directory Extract 1855 Biddestone



Biddestone is a township, parish, and village, divided into two parts, viz. St. Peter's and St. Nicholas, distant 4 miles west from Chippenham, 18 from Bristol and 98 from London, in the Hundred and Union of Chippenham, North Wilts., and bishopric of Gloucester and Bristol, situated on a brook called the Wavering. The church, St. Peter's, has been taken down. The living is a rectory, value £300, in the gift of the College of Winchester; the Rev. Andrew Quicke, M.A., is the incumbent; the Rev. Arthur Gauntlett Atherley, M.A., is the curate. The church, dedicated to St. Nicholas, is an ancient and plain structure, repaired about 1850; it has one bell. Here is a Baptist chapel, and a National school for boys and girls. The parish contains about 2,000 acres, and the population, in 1851, was 422 in St. Nicholas, and 25 in St. Peter's. Lord Methuen is lord of the manor. There are charities of £17 annual value, left by Lady James, to be distributed in clothes and coals at Christmas; also £6 per annum to the deserving poor at Christmas, left by W. Little.
