

Post Office Directory Extract 1855 Bowerchalke



Bower Chalke is a township, parish and village, in the Hundred of Chalke, Wilton Union, South Wilts, 10 miles Southwest of Salisbury and 105 miles from London. The population in 1851 was 509; it extends over 2,966 acres. The Earl of Pembroke is lord of the manor. The living is a vicarage in the gift of the Provost and Fellows of King's College, Cambridge. The church is very small, and built in a cruciform shape, with a small square tower and 3 bells; the Reverend Stephen Hawtrey, M. A., is vicar, and the Rev. William Reginald Whitworth is curate. There is a small national school supported by the Earl of Pembroke. This seems to have been a Roman camp. On the downs are barrows.

Quidlham Steet is half a mile west; Woodmington, 1 ½ miles south-west; Marlycombe, half a mile south; Knoyle, 1 ¼ miles south-east; Vernditch, 2 miles south-east.
