

BOX is a township, parish, railway stations and large village, on the Great Western Railway, 5 miles north-east of Bath, 8 north-west of Chippenham, and 101³/₄ from London, in the Hundred and Union of Chippenham, North Wilts. The living is a vicarage. The Rev. H. D. C. S. Horlock D.D., is the incumbent. The church is an ancient structure, with spire, containing 5 bells. Here is a chapel for Wesleyans, a chapel of ease at Kingsdon, and a National School for boys and girls. The population in 1851, was 1,987; the parish contains 4,217 acres. W. B. Worthey, Esq., is lord of the manor. The Great Western railway passes through a tunnel here called the Box Tunnel. Here are quarries. There is some brewing and malting.

HAZLEBURY, Wormwood, Rudloe, Cheney Court, Wadswick, Calls, Hill Farm, Sheylors and Slades are places in this township.
