

Toll Gate on a Typical Turnpike

Sheppards Shord and Sand Lane Turnpike

The Trustees acting under three several Acts of Parliament, one of which made in the second year of the reign of his late Majesty, one other made in the twenty-fifth year of the reign of the same King, and one other made and passed in the twenty-third year of his present Majesty, "for repairing the highways between Sheppards Shord and Horsely Upright Gate, leading down Bagdown-Hill, in the county of Wilts, and other ruinous parts of the highways thereunto adjacent," do hereby give notice, that all person who have any claim or demand whatever on the said roads, or under the said acts, are required to transmit an account of their respective demands to Mr. William Salmon, at Devizes, the Treasurer of the said turn-pike, or to the Trustees at their meeting, to be held at the Castle Inn, in Devizes, on Monday the fourth day of January next ensuing, at eleven o'clock in the forenoon, in order that the exact state of the said roads may be then ascertained and adjusted; and all claims, not exhibited according to this notice, will be disallowed.
