In the Name of God Amen The last Will and Testament of George Goldsborough of Slad in the Parish of Bradford in the County of Wiltshire Gentleman made and ordained the Seaventh day of August Anno Dm 1686 in manner and forme following that is to say I haveing first revoked made null and voyd all former and other Wills by me heretofore made whatsoever Doe first of all commend and commit my soul into the hands of Almighty God hoping assuredly to obteyne pardon of all my sinns through the onely merritts of Jesus Christ my Saviour and a blessed and a blessed and glorious Resurrection to life Eternall And as concerning what Estate Almighty God hath lent me in this world my Will is that the Same shall be disposed as following that is unto Alice my loveing wife I give and bequeath the sume of Twenty pounde a yeare to be paid her quarterly every yeare after my decease out of my ffarme called Slad ffarme for so long time as she shall live and remaine my Widow The first payment to begin and to be made at the first Quarter day next after my decease Also unto my said wife I give the use of all my household goods whiles she shall remain my Widow as aforesaid and upon her marriage or day of decease to be returned and remaine unto my said Executrixes as their owne proper goods as if no use thereof had been given to my said wife Item unto my sonne in Law Robert Pope and unto Anne my daughter his wife

and to every of them and to every of their Children I give and bequeath the Sume of twelve pence apeice and noe more
Item All the rest and residue of my Estate I give and bequeath joyntly unto my two Daughters Anne Gouldsbrough and
Jane Gouldsbrough and them I make joyntly Executrixes of this my last Will and Testament Nevertheless on this
Condition that they doe well and truely pay out of my said ffarme unto my said wife the said Sume of Twenty pounds a
Yeare dureing the said terme of her Widowhood on foure daies of payment in every yeare as aforesaid And if any
Quarterly Payment shall be behind and unpaid by the Space of Twenty daies next after the same shall become due That
then and in such case I hereby give power to my said wife to enter in and upon my said farme and the same to deteyne
and keepe dureinge her said Widowhood And I do hereby intreat and desire my loveing freind and Neighbour Mr Robert
Foot to be overseer of this my last Will and Testament to see as much as in him lyeth and to direct my said Executrixes in
the performance of this my last Will and Testament that they fulfill the true meaning herein and that they remaine in all
things dutifull and obedient unto their Mother my deare Wife In Witness whereof I have hereunto sett my hand and Seale
the day and yeare first above written *George Goldbrough*
