GUMM, DENNIS GEORGE - Private 5569491 - 5th Battalion, Wiltshire Regiment - Died 7th August 1944 - Age 33 - Born in Yarnbrook, North Bradley in 1911; Son of William Frederick and Lily Amy Gumm; Husband of Gertrude Louise Gumm of Chieveley, Berkshire - Buried at Banneville-La-Campagne War Cemetery, Calvados, France - Grave/Memorial Reference:- XVI. E. 20. - Headstone Inscription reads:- The Lord is My Shepherd, Therefore Can I Lack Nothing, Psalm XXIII - Commemorated on the Westbury Town War Memorial - Commemorated in The Central Council Memorial Book of Church Bell-Ringers, St. Paul's Cathedral. London.

HALLETT, HARRY ROBERT - Warrant Officer Class II/Company Sergeant Major 2321628 - V Corps Signals, Royal Corps of Signals - Died 3rd May 1942 - Age 31 - Born in Ireland; Son of Harry Robert and Elizabeth S. Hallett; Husband of Marjorie Hallett - Buried in Bratton (St. James) Churchyard, Bratton - Grave/Memorial Reference: Row 5 Grave 66 - Headstone Inscription reads: - At Rest, In God's Beautiful Garden, Sheltered, From Sorrow and Pain. - Commemorated on the Bratton Village War Memorial - Commemorated on the St James the Great Church Roll of Honour, Bratton.

HYATT, VINCENT LONGMEAD - Flying Officer/Air Bomber 132394 - 102 Squadron, Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve - Died 3rd October 1943 - Age 27 - Son of Mr. and Mrs. Harry Hyatt of Bratton - Buried in Bratton (St. James) Churchyard, Bratton - Grave/Memorial Reference: - North of church - Headstone Inscription reads: - At the Going Down of the Sun And in the Morning We Will Remember Him - Commemorated on the Bratton Village War Memorial - Commemorated on the St James the Great Church Roll of Honour, Bratton

WATTS, REGINALD CHARLES - Private 6029064 - 1st Battalion, Cambridgeshire Regiment - Died 7th February 1944 - Age 29 - Son of Charles and Eliza Watts of Bratton - Buried at Chungkai War Cemetery, Thailand - Grave/Memorial Reference:- 8. L. 10. - Headstone Inscription reads:- In God's Safe Keeping, Gone But Always With Us- Commemorated on the Bratton Village War Memorial - Commemorated on the St. James the Great Church Roll of Honour, Bratton.
