WHITAKER – Elizabeth Whitaker of Bratton in the parish of Westbury county of Wilts, widow, friends William Axford of Erlestoke, county Wilts, gentleman, John Drewett of Bratton, gentleman, brother James Salmon of Burnett, county Somerset, and Jeffrey Whitaker of Bratton, schoolmaster, their executors and administrators, the house she dwells in and the estate thereunto belonging and all her personal estate in trust to the use of son John Whitaker until he comes to the age of one and twenty years and then to said son, his heirs and assigns forever, if son John dies before he is twenty one years old and without lawful issue, then she leaves all her real and personal estate to her brother James Salmon his heirs and assigns forever. Also she desires her said trustees to pay 20s yearly towards the support of the Baptist Meeting in Bratton until her son is twenty one years old "if religious service is there maintained so long, not otherwise". Son John Whitaker sole executor and the said trustees executors in trust during his minority and to each trustee a gold ring. Dated 8th June 1741.
