Monumental Inscriptions from gravestones in the Churchyard

First World War 1914-1918

In Loving Memory of Lance Corp. Arthur Frank **Carter** (1st Wiltshire Regiment) son of Frank and Martha Carter who died of wounds received whilst fighting for his King and County in France June 14th 1915

In Loving Memory of Our Beloved Son Charles Alexander Robertson **Gatley** M.R.C.S, I.R.C.P., R.A.M.C. who died of wounds received in France February 28th 1921 aged 31 years

41283 Private A.T. Merrett Devonshire Regiment 1st December 1918

(**Scott**) Also of their son Fred who was killed in action Oct 1917 aged 20 years. Buried at Menin Rd. Ypres

(**Watts**) Also of his son Philip John **Watts** late of 13th Battalion of Canadian Regiment who died 13th May 1934 from the effects of wounds received in the Great War aged 40.
