Item I give to my son Thomas Croome twenty pounds of lawful English money to be paid in one year after my decease Item I give to my son William Croome twenty pounds of lawful English money to be paid in one year after my decease. Item I give to my daughter Elizabeth twenty pounds of lawful English money to be paid in one year after my decease if my Executors think fit I give to my daughter Joane St..... Item I give to Betty St..... the elder daughter of Joane St...... Ten pounds of lawful English money to be paid in two years after my decease Item I give Joane St... other children five pounds a piece to be paid in three years after my decease Item I give all the rest of my grand children one shilling a piece. Item I give to my servant Elizabeth Follar twenty shillings to be paid in one year after my decease. Item I give to the poor of Bratton to be distributed by my John..... and sole Executor of all my goods and chattels whatsoever I do appoint to be my **Executors Henry Ballard Philip King** John Croome make witnesseth to his Will Henry Ballard Thomas Smith William Curate John Minty Philip King Churchwardens his mark **Philip King**
