At Calne Town Hall 21st May 1855 Jane Haddrell v William Cook

Service of Summons on 3rd May 1855 served by James Wick.

Jane Haddrell swore & saith:-

I am a single woman and living in the parish of Bremhill. On the 23rd of February last I was delivered of a male child. I charge William Cook with being the father. I kept company with him for two years when we were both living at Wootton Bassett. I was living in service with Mr. Proud a draper and Cook was living with his father who was a plumber. He promised to marry me after I was in the family way and he gave me half a sovereign and 1/6 a week.

Mary Webb swore & saith:-

I am sister of the complainant living at Broughton Gifford. My sister came to me and was taken ill and confined at my house. He promised to keep the child. I wrote the letters to which the two now produced are answers.

Ordered to pay two shillings and six pence a week from the birth and 10 shillings for midwife and costs 12 shillings and six pence.
