

Church Matters 1800-1849

1804

His Grace the Archbishop of Canterbury has presented the Rev William Lisle Bowles AM to the Vicarage of Bremhill, in this county, worth £500 per annum, also vacated by the death of Mr Hune. **Salisbury and Winchester Journal Monday 7 May 1804**

1828

On Thursday the Rev W L Bowles, Rector of Bremhill, was elected a Canon Residentiary of Salisbury Cathedral, in the room of the late Venerable Archdeacon Coxe. The Very Rev the Dean afterwards entertained the Chapter and a select party at his residence in that city. **Hampshire Chronicle Monday 18 August 1828**

1841

It is understood that the Vicarage of Britford, near this city, just fallen vacant, will be conferred on the Rev M Buxton, Curate to the Rev Canon Bowles at Bremhill. Canon Bowles being the member of the Chapter who has the right to this opportunity to reward the long and valuable services of his worthy coadjutor. **Salisbury and Winchester Journal Monday 8 November 1841**

1845

The Lord Bishop of Salisbury has been pleased to confer on the Rev Henry Drury, clerk, late curate of Bromham, Wilts, the vicarage of Bremhill, with the chapelries of Foxham and Highway, recently rendered vacant by the resignation of the Rev William Lisle Bowles, clerk. **Devizes and Wiltshire Gazette Thursday 9 January 1845**

1849

Tenders to be sent to us free of expense on or before the 18th of August next. The lowest tender will not necessarily be accepted. Grant to Bremhill Church, £50. "The work contemplated in this case is the complete restoration of the church, including a new roof and re-pewing open sittings, with the building of a vestry. In

conjunction with which work 56 free sittings will be gained. The estimated cost of the whole exceeds £700." Salisbury and Winchester Journal Saturday 27 October 1849
