

FUNERAL OF WILLIAM POWNEY

On Monday last, Mr William Powney, for 52 years clerk of Bremhill Church, was buried in Bremhill churchyard. The bell ringers determined to bury him with the usual honours and this intention getting known, attracted a good many spectators. At 3 o'clock the muffled knell began to give forth its solemn tones. At 4 o'clock the body was borne to the church, and, as it was carried to the grave a muffled chime of bells was rung. The Rev E P Eddrup very impressively read the service, and, after the mourners had left the grave, a muffled peal was given. There were many marks of respect shown to the deceased throughout the village.
