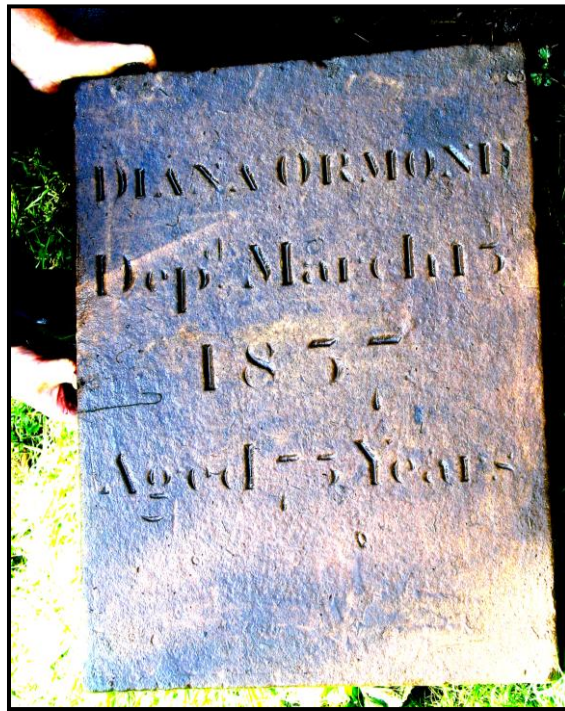

The Girls' School

Enlargement, showing the four women in front of the church. Perhaps girls from the Moravian School? Or daughters of a Moravian minister? The girls' clothes are Victorian. But most importantly, for dating, the old (pre-1896) gables on the church are still present. This picture could have been taken as little as 20-25 years after Leonora's death, and she may well have dressed much as these girls are here.
