

BREMHILL PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

A synopsis of Bremhill Parish Council's recent meeting

We are still waiting for the Operational Noise Management Plan for the Defence College of Technical Training at Lyneham. Mr Tucker is working hard to contact Simon Smith at Wiltshire Council.

There has been no further communication from TGC Renewables regarding the Proposed Solar Panel site at Foxham¹.

The Neighbourhood Plan has received some good correspondence to look at and to work on. The Plan takes approximately two years to produce as the 1st year is the information process and the 2nd is for consultation. It is recommended to let every household to have a draft copy and if agreed will be put to the Parish to vote on.

Wiltshire Council has sought an order to close Turf House Lane to carry out drainage surveying maintenance and resurfacing. This is to take place from 25th November to 20th December 2013 between the hours of 8am to 4.30pm. The order will further recommence for a day on the 13th January 2014 for resurfacing. The closures will be clearly indicated by traffic signs.

The date of the next meeting will be 2nd December 2013 at The Moravian Room East Tytherton at 7.30pm. Members of the public and press are welcome to attend.



OUR VALIANT PURSUIT TO PRESERVE TYTHERTON VILLAGE HALL

As residents within the Tytherton area will be aware, the Village Hall was established as a community facility in 1924. It had a ninety-nine year lease, which was decreased to ninety-two years after the death of all the primary Trustees.

With this in mind, it is crucial that a new site is found before the lease expires in January 2016 and enough revenue is accumulated for it to be reborn before the closure of a much beloved pinnacle of the community.

The continuation of the Village Hall is vital for a variety of reasons. It serves as the centre point of the village where local people can meet; it is instrumental in preserving economic trade activities; it provides positive recreational facilities (for children and adults alike) in their spare time; it also raises money for charitable organizations and helps deliver inspiring projects within the village and beyond.

Committed members of the hall have gone to an extraordinary effort to highlight the matter, intending to raise a minimum of fifty thousand pounds to reach some kind of resolution. Help to reach this sum might include generous grants. The main goal would be the construction of another hall on a more suitable site nearby, accessible to everyone.

Many suggestions have been made about how to move forward by raising awareness and organising fund-raising events, but concerted action is now required to rectify the situation.

A general meeting will be held on Tuesday 3rd December 8pm in the Village Hall, to which everybody is invited. The topic will be "To close the existing hall, release the assets and transfer to a new charitable status". A website has been created where you can read the Constitution which has been prepared. You can access this website at www.tythertonhall.co.uk. Please do get involved and share your ideas.

WINTER FEEDING FOR OUR FEATHERED FRIENDS

In a hard winter, birds may have difficulty finding food so an extra meal from either your kitchen or some commercial bird food will help keep them going. Feed them until the end of April, when they should usually be able to find food for themselves.


Food you can put out for birds include:

- Peanuts in shells threaded together on string
- Unsalted peanuts in feeders (peanuts can be naturally contaminated with an invisible toxin so make sure you buy nuts that are of guaranteed quality)
- Wild bird seed.
- Net-free suet or fat balls- netting can trap and kill wildlife so always remove it.
- Crumbled or grated cheese.
- Pastry, stale cake, biscuits and breadcrumbs (moisten the bread if it's very dry)
- Cooked rice, potato and pasta.
- Uncooked and unsalted bacon rind.
- Raisins and other dried fruit (soaked in water first) *
- Bruised fruit such as apples and pears.
- Fresh coconut in the shell is a great favourite with tits. Drill two holes in one end and drain off the milk. Saw the coconut in half and hang it outside. Never put out desiccated coconut, as it swells up inside a bird's stomach.

Try not to put food too close to bushes, as cats may lie in v pounce. Birds also need plenty of water to drink and to bat the water and clean the bowl daily. Also remember to keep free of ice during very cold weather.

Bread tends to fill birds up with little nutritional benefit bu be part of the varied assortment of food on your bird table. Brown is preferable, and all bread should be soaked first.

* Beware: Grapes, sultanas, raisins and some artificial sweeteners can be extremely toxic to dogs. They should be placed on a raised bird table and never scattered on the ground.



EVEREST MARATHON 2013

This is not a double glazing promotional event, it is a marathon (26.2 miles) starting at Everest base camp - the highest marathon in the world. A plan to enter this event was conceived in Stockholm July 2012, when our friend Malc told us of his intention to run this event to celebrate his 50th birthday. Trin, also turning 50 in 2013, was sold on the idea. I needed little persuading. Once there, we will have a few days in the Nepalese capital before flying on to Lukla, from where we will begin a 16 day trek into the Khumbu valley and up to Gorak Shep, the old Everest base camp.

The race starts here at 5184m on Thursday 28th November and the course follows the trekking trail back to Namche Bazaar at 3446m. The terrain, the altitude and the weather, mean that times do not compare to sea level races and completion is the only goal for most competitors. The course record of 3.50.23 was set by a Nepalese runner in 2000. At this moment the prospects are both exciting and daunting. Both Trin and I have been preparing as best we can, making full use of the Top2Toe studio and pounding the lanes around the village.

The fund uses money raised to support charities in the region, such as Nepal Schools Project, Nepal Leprosy Trust, Britain-Nepal Medical Trust, and many more. The fourteen races held so far have raised nearly £600,000.

SO JUST WHAT IS IT WORTH?

This was the question put to me by a friend who had just inherited a stamp collection from his uncle.

As this friend lives many miles away we corresponded by email and I could see from the very first photos that he sent that this was a collection well beyond the ordinary. One of the prize stamps in the collection was from 1882 and cost £5 then, so there are not many of those around for sure. A quick check in my Stanley Gibbons catalogue gave the value at £70,000 for this one stamp alone!

Stanley Gibbons is amongst the most expensive places to buy stamps and this is their <u>selling</u> price. Their buying price would be very different for example if I buy stamps I hope to get them for around 10% of the SG price but none the less I could not imagine spending £7,000 on a single STAMP! (It's more than my car is worth!)

Not many people collect stamps these days so finding a specialist buyer is a big problem for many hence the need for stamp dealers (like Stanley Gibbons). Of course the dealer is only really thinking about what they can sell for, they then have to factor in their overheads and profit margin so the price you'll be quoted for your collection has to reflect this. All modern, decimal stamps are still valid for postage but even then a dealer may only give 50-60% of the 'face' value for decimal stamps in mint condition.

Stamps are printed in massive quantities (around 70 million penny blacks for example) so most are not particularly rare or valuable but finding them in good condition or special varieties IS a challenge and increases value markedly.

Many people have stamps in their attic that will be deteriorating daily as the damp air accelerates 'foxing' – rust like patches that collectors hate. If this is you then maybe it's time to get the collection back into the dry again?



So what happened to my friend? Well, to cut a long story very short we managed to find a local collector for him and one sunny day back in May the entire collection was set out in Bremhill Village Hall and sold for an amazing £37,000 (are you thinking again about the trip to the attic?)
