NEWSLETTER AGM

The AGM was held on 28th November in Bremhill Village Hall.

In matters arising, the possibility of the Newsletter gaining charitable status was again raised and will be further considered by the committee. It was also reported that, despite some competitive printing tenders, we were very satisfied with the excellent quality of our present printer and had no intention to move from him.

The Chair (David Stevens) then gave a short history of the development of the Newsletter and noted that the publication was now five years old. He thanked all those without whom it could not happen, mentioning especially the generous financial support from many sources. He concluded that he felt privileged to have been part of the publication's development, but had now decided to resign as Chair, effective from this meeting. Ewen Bird was elected as new Chair, with the Committee and village reps all continuing as before.

The finance report showed that the Newsletter was financially fairly healthy, an improvement on the previous year. The decision taken at the last AGM to raise advertising rates had had little negative effect, with advertising income

remaining almost as before.

Finally, under AoB, Richard Tucker wished to record the meeting's thanks and appreciation to the outgoing Chair for all his work in setting up and supporting the development of the Newsletter to the high standard we have today. The meeting was unanimous in supporting this.

The next meeting is to be held in November 2018 and full minutes of the meeting are available should anyone wish to see them.

BREMHILL PARISH HISTORY PROJECT

The inaugural meeting of this new project will take place from 7 pm on Monday 15th January 2018 in the Bremhill Village Hall. Everyone will be most welcome. The project aims to research and produce an engaging publication on the history of Bremhill Parish (including all the villages) and in parallel provide a chapter for the Victoria County History (VCH) of Wiltshire. We have been surprised by the amount of historical material already available covering Stanley Abbey, the churches, Moravians, Quakers, schools, reading rooms, other listed buildings, Maud Heath's causeway, the canal and railway. But there is much more to research!

We are delighted by the early interest in engaging with this project - whether to contribute material, help with the research or just to follow what we uncover. So far, we have formed a small committee drawn from across the parish: Martin Nye, Helen Stuckey, Sarah Jones, John Harris and Bob Harding. We also have the support of John Chandler, a trustee of the Wiltshire VCH, and Julie Davis from the hire History Centre (W&SHC) in Chippenham.

John and Julie will be joining us for this first meeting when we plan to:

- outline our plans for producing both the engaging publication, as well as the VCH chapters. We will have some examples of other local history publications;
- describe the kinds of sources that volunteer researchers might work with and how to use the W&SHC.
- ascertain who is interested in being involved, in what capacity and areas of interest.
- agree where and when further sessions should be held e.g. daytime sessions at the W&SHC working with original documents and evening meetings in Bremhill with experts in various fields.

It would be really helpful if you could email helenstuckey@btinternet.com to indicate if you might be able to come to this inaugural meeting. Equally, if you are interested but can't make this meeting, let us know and we will catch up with you directly.

We will give you regular updates in the Newsletter.

BOOK REVIEW

"Hide and Seek" by Ian Rankin an Inspector Rebus novel.

I had not read any Ian Rankin novels, although he is one of the UK's foremost current novelists. I generally enjoy a good detective story, so I decided to have a go. I was not disappointed.

"A junkie lies dead in an Edinburgh squat - spread-eagled, cross like on the floor between two burned down candles, a five pointed star daubed on the wall above. Just another dead addict, until John Rebus begins to chip away at the indifference, treachery, deceit and sleaze that lurk behind the façade of Edinburgh familiar to the tourists. Only Rebus seems to care about a death which looks more like a murder every day, about seductive danger he can almost taste, appealing to the darkest corners of his mind."

Having worked in Bath, I know there is depravation and sleaze behind some of the Georgian exterior. Rankin describes these aspects of Edinburgh so well. Oh, yes, I will be reading more Inspector Rebus in future!

Following on from the review by the Government Inspector and Decision Notice by Wiltshire Council you will be asked to vote for adoption of your Bremhill Neighbourhood Plan on the 8th February 2018. Four years of consultation process has shaped the key points of the Plan.

General Development

Small - scale development, where appropriate to the setting, using infill sites and conversions to provide up to 20 new homes by 2030. A mix of housing to suit local needs.

Protecting our Open countryside

Preventing coalescence between Bremhill village and the parish boundary to the west of Calne.

Preserving the Marden Valley

Maintaining visual separation between Tytherton Lucas and Chippenham to preserve the unspoilt nature of the River Marden valley for amenity and leisure.

Biodiversity

Development should protect our landscapes, woodland, hedgerows, ponds, lakes, rivers, streams, ditches and wildlife habitats with ecology buffers.

Green Space at Lodowicks

Land at Lodowicks, Bremhill is designated as Local Green Space for the benefit of the community.

Jobs and Commerce

Supporting existing jobs and new employment opportunities including farm diversity. Implementation of fast broadband to support business, home working and domestic use.

Traffic management and accessibility

Ensuring that horse riders, cyclists, walkers and drivers can safely co-exist on parish roads. Identifying road areas which require maintenance. Supporting Community Speedwatch initiatives including traffic signage.



GARDENING NOTES - JANUARY

Happy New Gardening Year!

Flowers that will be flowering shortly are Hamamelis, Daphne, Mahonia, all of which are shrubs. Iris unguicularis, Cyclamen coum, Winter Aconites, Hellebores, Crocus, Snowdrops and many more. Take a note of those you would like to plant later in the year.

This is a good time to build a compost bin and wash down the glass of an empty greenhouse ready for the seeds.

Prune overgrown Viburnum by cutting out old woody stems, add a mulch with slow release fertilizer around the roots. Pune back vines and wisteria to the most vigorous side shoots by at least two thirds. Remove any weak and twiggy growth. Prune Apple trees this month. Apply a grease band around the trunks to prevent the wingless moths crawling up the trunk to lay eggs on the branches thus preventing the caterpillars eating the blossom and fruitlets.

Sow Chillie seeds now. They grow very slowly. Put in a heated greenhouse or on a windowsill, a temperature of around 25c is needed for germination. Set early and second early potatoes to chit. Put trays in a cool frost free place with good light.





REVEREND LINDA

Dear Friends. At this time of year, we celebrate Epiphany and hear the story of the wise men, Caspar, Melchior and Balthazar, who journeyed to kneel before the Christ-child. But did you know about the other wise man, named Artaban?



Artaban arranges to meet up with his fellow stargazers to travel together to find the King and worship him. Artaban sells everything to buy a special gift for the King, a sapphire, a ruby and a pearl.

However, on his way to meet the others, Artaban comes upon a wounded man. He tends his wounds, feeds him, and stays until the man recovers. He sells his sapphire to buy a fresh horse but it is too late. Artaban reaches Bethlehem. The other wise men are on their way home, and Joseph and Mary have fled to Egypt with the baby Jesus. Herod's slaughter of children is occurring so he uses his ruby to save a young woman's baby.

Artaban takes up his quest once more and travels to Egypt and other places to search for the King. On his way, he feeds the hungry, clothes the naked, heals the sick and comforts the captive. 33 years later he finds himself in Jerusalem. Before Christ's crucifixion he gives his pearl to save a young woman from slavery. Artaban has come too late for the King. But, he hears his King say: "Truly I tell you, just as you did it to one of the least of these who are members of my family, you did it to me."

I wonder how many of us find ourselves looking back over the previous twelve months, and asking "If only?" or "What if?". "If only I had done that instead of this?". Perhaps for some, the good and positive things which have happened are somehow eclipsed by sad and terrible events. For others the future is uncertain and the way ahead unclear.

Artaban did not come to his King empty handed. He gave his material gifts, but he gave much more. Be encouraged by the other wise man. Let us go forward with great hope that all things can be possible-trusting God to walk with us. So let us do justice, love kindness and walk humbly with God through 2018.
