BREMHILL PARISH COUNCIL

The minutes of the latest meeting held on the 30th September are yet to be approved and will be put on the Bremhill Village website. Two main points were discussed in the meeting- firstly, that the application by the MOD for a Training College of Technical Training has been passed by Wiltshire Council. This is subject to many conditions, one of which is the Operational Noise Management Plan (ONMP) which aims to provide an "open, flexible and transparent mechanism for maintaining control of noise intrusion, with representation from local stakeholders". This must be approved prior to any external training areas becoming operational and then will be frequently monitored. The full document can be seen on the North Wilts Planning website.

A Neighbourhood Plan for the Bremhill Parish is being drafted which contains a vision of future development for the area and will be the subject of a public meeting for the purposes of feedback early in the new year. It will also be put on the new Bremhill Parish Council website which will be launched soon and link with the existing Bremhill village website.

OLD DOGS AND NEW TRICKS

I've always liked the flute and I had started to learn the instrument many years ago, but demands of work intervened and prevented any real progress from my early attempts to produce anything like an agreeable sound and I soon gave up my efforts. However, a few years ago, after my whingeing about wanting to start again and doing nothing about it, my wife bought me a course of lessons with an unsuspecting teacher. So I took the plunge, a deep breath and started again!

I still remember the resentment I felt at the age of eleven when my parents insisted that I gave up my Saturday mornings to visit a stern, rather unforgiving lady who gave me piano lessons. Surely they realised Saturday mornings were the time for seeing friends and playing football? I made relatively little progress, although that may have had more to do with insufficient practice than any lack of talent. However, she did teach me one thing which has proved important to me in my life - how to read music. So, once I got over the rather embarrassing moment, in front of my new teacher, of having to lift the instrument to my lips and make the first sounds on it for 25 years, we were able to move on reasonably quickly from the basics.

It is a truism that the teacher is all important and I have been very lucky in my wife's choice! Your teacher needs to be sympathetic, have infinite patience, the ability to smile and to be encouraging, even when he or she may simply wish to walk quietly away! Susan has a huge capacity for all of these even

when, while playing, I can sense the gritting of t' behind me and the whispered "C sharp!" when I played C natural. Or, in answer to my question 'that suddenly an F sharp?" the intake of breath, the sigh and the answer "Because the key changes to E minor there." "Oh, I see." I don't, of course - and then the dreaded follow up "You need to do more theory, don't you!" Oh, the shame! Yes, I do and I'm back to being the eleven-year old, full of excuses for not doing his homework!

Despite the fact that fingers no longer move quickly and messages from the brain to the fingers take longer to arrive, resulting in most pieces being played 'adagio' whatever their time-signature, we have persevered and made progress. There are some sticking points in getting the highest notes - and I still avoid the theory! But under Susan's guidance, we have played a large range of music, I have learned much about different styles and I listen to music now with far greater understanding.

Re-learning the flute has given me huge pleasure. It must be, I suppose, a bit like golf - one day you play well and the next day, irritation takes over because you just can't seem to do anything right and the club or flute gets thrown down in frustration! But there is real excitement in making a pleasing sound and playing through a new piece of music. You can teach an old dog new tricks and the result is worth the trying! Go on, try something!



BLACKBERRY AND ALMOND MADEIRA CAKE

I made this for Nic's 30th birthday when I wasn't even going out with him and then look what happened!!

- 175g Butter, softened
- 175g caster sugar
- 1 tsp vanilla essence
- 3 eggs, lightly beaten
- Grated zest of 1 orange
- 50g flaked almonds
- 100g plain flour
- 100g self-raising flour
- 2 tbsp milk
- 8 oz blackberries fresh or frozen
- Icing sugar
- 1. Preheat the oven to 160 C. Line a deep 20cm cake tin. Cream the butter and sugar. Beat in the vanilla, then gradually beat in the eggs.
- 2. Stir in the zest and all but a few almonds crumbling them. Fold in the sifted flours and milk, then fold in all but eight of the blackberries.
- 3. Put the mixture in the tin and level, then arrange the remaining blackberries on top. Sprinkle over the remaining almonds and bake for 1 hour and 15 mins.
- 4. Cool in the tin for 10 mins, then cool on a rack. Dust with icing sugar.

Small Thoughts of a Large Clergyman

"How time flies" – bit of a cliché I know, but it does seem that the older we get the faster the years seem to pass! And the great events in our lives - first day at school, first job, marriage, first house, first child, and so on—we look back and say "Was it really that long ago. It seems like only yesterday!" Just the other day I passed such a milestone, twenty five years in ordained ministry! And I really am amazed at the speed at which those years have passed! But perhaps I shouldn't be too surprised, because they have been years full of joy, full of satisfaction, in many ways the best and most fulfilling part of my life so far. And (another cliché!) "time flies when you are having fun!"

Twenty-five years in which my life has changed in ways that I could never have envisaged when I was younger. In fact if you had suggested even a few

years before I began my training, that one day I might appear in public sporting a dog collar (other than at a fancy dress party of course) I would have laughed at you and my laughter would have been augmented by the laughter of my friends! "Jim Scott a clergyman? You have got to be joking!" Not that I was ever particularly wicked, but my

attitude to church going and organised religion was one of great scepticism. Brought up as a churchgoer, I had developed the cynicism common to many young people in the fifties and sixties, and it remained part of my nature well into early middle age – even though I was married to the sweetest Christian girl that you were ever likely to meet. I had rejected the divinity of Christ at a very early age, but strangely I had never wavered in my belief that the teaching of Jesus, particularly that dealing with our relations with others, was the way to live our lives. But – all this Resurrection stuff, Virgin birth stories – leave it out! I don't want to know!

SO – WHAT HAPPENED? What miracle took this happy agnostic from joyful disbelief to a contented and convinced follower of the Man whom he had rejected for so many years. From someone who mocked the faith of others to one whose own faith grew (illogically, some would say) to the extent that he knew that only ordination would satisfy this ever growing sense of vocation. It's difficult, looking back, to point to any one event or person that triggered off this complete change of attitude toward religion, and Christianity in particular. One major event does spring to mind. My family moving back to Bremhill, the parish where I was born and brought up, with all the association with the Church that this pre-cynical boy was exposed to. But perhaps the

major influence was a saintly clergyman, a retired Archdeacon of Wiltshire The Reverend Canon Cecil Plaxton, who looked after St Martin's church during a very long reorganisation. He was long retired, even then.

Why me? This very reluctant Pilgrim. Why me? And the answer comes from our Lord himself. We don't chose him, he chooses us!

God Bless – and if your very fortunate it could happen to you!
