THE SKY AT NIGHT - NOVEMBER

This months article is dedicated to "La Luna", the moon, the earth's lone satellite in space. The reason for this dedication is that on the 14th November we have the "Supermoon". This may be the second of three supermoons this year, but it will be the biggest and brightest. The skies around our villages will be illuminated by a magical light show. The last time the moon came this close to the earth was in 1948.

The moon is the largest and brightest object in the night sky and the only one whose features can be easily seen with the naked eye. Whilst the moon is a brilliant light source we can only see the moon because light from the sun bounces off it back to earth.

With a diameter of one quarter of the size of earth, the moon is an average of 238,900 miles away. Despite this distance, the moon dictates the rise and fall of our tides because of its gravitational forces. So when we have a Supermoon, we will experience substantial high and low tides.

As the moon is in a synchronised rotation with earth, it means the same side is always facing the earth. The far side of the moon is sometimes called the dark side, despite the fact that it is illuminated by the sun just as much as the side we can see.

Whilst before my time, I am sure many of you will remember the infamous black and white footage beamed to earth of Apollo 11 landing on the moon on the 20th July 1969. We heard Neil Armstrong saying "That's one small step for [a] man, one giant leap for mankind". I think he was forgiven for fluffing his line a little!

So why don't you make a note in your diary for the 14th?

And finally, we have all heard of the man on the moon, but have you ever wondered how he cuts his hair? 'E clipses it' (sorry, I couldn't resist!).



BOOK REVIEW


Charlotte Gray by Sebastian Faulks

You may be familiar with the books of Sebastian Faulks, including Birdsong, perhaps his best known work about WWI. Charlotte Gray is book is about Vichy France during WW2.

Charlotte Gray is a young Scottish woman who has an affair with a pilot. She is also courted by an organization that sounds like SOE because of her fluent French. However, her lover is lost over France, so her determination to go on an operation to France increases with an almost primary desire to find him.

The story tells of the characters she meets and the experiences she has supporting the fledgling resistance. As you can imagine, not everything goes to plan and she also has to face the reality of life in Vichy France at the time. The transportation of Jews, the collaboration of some of the French and the increasing German occupation.

This book gives a good insight into life in 1943 when the tide was beginning to turn towards the Allies, Faulk has this ability to describe his characters so clearly



and make you believe that they could have really existed. It is very readable and something that teenagers could easily find absorbing.

Although I enjoyed it, the film of the book, starring Cate Blanchett and Rupert Perry-Jones, did not get good reviews and the storyline in the film did not remain true to the book either. Whether you have seen the film or not, please read the book. You will enjoy it.

A TRIBUTE BY CANON BOWLES' to the heroes of the Battle of Waterloo.

Just as the the Earl Haig Fund was established in 1921 initially to assist exservicemen in the aftermath of The Great War, a century earlier, after the Battle of Waterloo in 1815, benefit services were held nationwide during August with special collections for the dependants of the fallen. This was observed in Bremhill church and reported thus in The Salisbury and Winchester Journal:

'On Sunday the 20th instant a sermon was preached at the parish church of Bremhill....by the Rev. W.L.Bowles, and a collection made for the benefit of the widows and orphans of the brave men who fell at the battle of Waterloo. In the course of the service, which was conducted in a most devout and impressive manner, two pieces of beautiful music, with appropriate words from the pen of the Rev. Mr. Bowles, were sung under the direction of Mr. Coombs, [organist and composer] of Chippenham, by several ladies and gentlemen present. One of these compositions, adapted to Dr. [Benjamin] Cooke's well-known glee. "How sleep the brave," containing the following eloquent stanza: -

"How sleep the brave, who sink to rest"
"By all their country's wishes blest!"
When cold upon the distant plain
The soldier lies mid heaps of slain,
We call on thee, O God, to bless
The Widowed and the fatherless.
Behold - behold the orphan's tear
The sighs of mourning mothers hear;
And while, to soothe their bitter woe,
Compassion shall here write bestow,
Still let them kneel before thy throne,
And seek -- seek peace from Thee alone.



The church was overflowing; and the powerful arguments and truly pathetic eloquence of the preacher deeply affected the hearts of all present. A very liberal subscription followed on the occasion.....'

The London composer and organist of Westminster Abbey, Benjamin Cooke (1734-1793) originally composed this Dirge as a Glee in 1771 to words by William Collins (1721-1793) which won the Prize Medal of The Glee Club. It was published in 1775 from which Bowles retained Collins's first two lines followed by his own. For the above performance, Bowles, or Coombs (presumably at the latter's request) substituted this text to Cooke's music.

Calne Young Farmers


Calne Young Farmers is a local club within the heart of Wiltshire.

Cover brassicas with netting to guard against pigeon damage. Protect carrots by removing foliage and covering with a layer of straw weighed down by some netting. Prune currant bushes. Sow broad beans and garlic.

Trees and shrubs can be moved now as the soil is still warm. Ensure alpines have grit around them to prevent rot. Plant up winter tubs using a free draining compost. Raise pots off the ground to aid drainage.

Clear out compost bins and use the dark crumbly compost. Gather leaves to make leaf mould. They will rot down well in plastic sacks. Make a few holes in the full sacks to let air in. Store for about 12 to 18 months.

Tidy up beds and borders removing annual plants that have died back. Clear out dead stems and leaves which might cause the plant crowns to rot. Leave some seed heads which will provide valuable food for birds and hollow stems will give insects shelter. Apply mulch to borders to insulate the roots of plants and enrich the soil.

Feed birds regularly as winter arrives, also fresh water for them to drink and bath in. Hedgehogs are still around and need extra nutrition and water. Be aware that they are out and about much earlier as the days shorten and may be crossing roads. There are a number in the Bremhill area so please drive carefully.

RURAL POLICING MATTERS

Wiltshire Police were part of a multi-agency team that stopped and checked 46 vehicles and 9 people during a rural crime operation to disrupt criminal activity recently in South Wiltshire.

Approximately 50 staff from Wiltshire Police, the Rural Crime Team, Dorset Police, Hampshire Police, Tri-force specialist officers, the Special Constabulary, the Office of the PCC and volunteers from the National Gamekeepers Association and the National Farmers Union came together as one team.

South Wiltshire Sector Inspector Peter Sparrow said: "Now the harvest has been gathered in it has opened up vast areas of agricultural land for potential poaching offences, acquisitive crime and damage. One of the misconceptions I am keen to correct is that the police have withdrawn from the rural communities. Wiltshire is a rural county and I want to reassure the rural communities that their needs are not being ignored. Operation Engage, a series of countywide operations targeting rural crime, was designed to directly address these concerns. I am determined operations like this are repeated on a regular basis."

Police and Crime Commissioner Angus Macpherson said: "Wiltshire is a rural county and it is important that the Force police rural crime as part of its overall policing."

How shall we respond to the boy from Aleppo and others like him? We could, like the Levite in the story of the Good Samaritan, walk over, look at him and pass by on the other side of the road.

We certainly should pray for our own leaders - to ask God to give wisdom to our governments so that they can try to formulate and execute policies towards a just peace in the world. However, I propose that in a democratic society how we live can influence government. How we live matters.



John Clare (1793-1864) was an English poet, the son of a farm labourer from Northumberland, who was known for his evocative pictures of the countryside. He is considered to be among the most important 19th-century poets and has been described as the greatest labouring-class poet that England has ever produced, writing powerfully about nature and his rural childhood.
