### GARDEN NOTES FOR SEPTEMBER

Continue to dead head Dahlias and Cosmia, but leave a few heads to go to seed. Transplant or plant out seeding Foxgloves in flower position. Cut back perennials which are looking tatty; however these stems and seed heads do provide shelter for wildlife over the winter. This is a good time to divide Alchemilla to rejuvenate old clumps. Spring bulbs are now available to plant.

Autumn Raspberries are a real treat and usually at their best in September. Harvest runner beans regularly. Prop up pumpkins on a slate so they can ripen in the sun. When foliage on Asparagus starts to turn yellow, cut back to 2-3 cms. Put foliage on the compost, tickle the soil around the plants and add compost to the area. Some apples will be ripe so pick before they drop. Plant new strawberry runners for great fruit next year.

This is a good time to erect a bug house or wildlife stack for creatures to overwinter in. Take a look online for suggestions as to how to make one. Beware, Vine Weevils are very active over the next few months. Water in biological nematodes before the weather gets cold. The weevils prefer to live in pots so it is easier to use the nematodes on them.

### **CHARLES RODWELL**

### **Painter in Charlcutt**

For the last 25 years Charles has looked out of his hill-top studio at Charlcutt and felt compelled to paint views of the everchanging seasonal light on the pattern of fields in the valley below him. That said, his figurative painting and drawing style has also been shaped by his travels across the globe.

Having trained at The Slade, University College London, gaining a Diploma in Fine Art, he packed his art materials and a small tent in a rucksack to set off for a 20 month adventure into the creative unknown. The 'Mardi Gras' in New Orleans, tribal art in Tahiti, the vast open landscapes in Australia and the bustling 24 hr. street markets in Kowloon, Hong Kong were all catalysts to get him painting the vivid canvasses of life as it unfolded on his travels.



By complete contrast
Charles put down some
roots in Wiltshire by renting
a tiny idyllic cottage in
Savernake Forest. After 2
years he moved to bigger
(and warmer!) premises in
Marlborough High Street
where he established a
studio/gallery combining
sales of his work to local
clients with visits to Hong
Kong and the West Coast of
Scotland to promote his
work through exhibitions.

Recording the landscapes and way of life in different areas of the world led him to a fascination with the colours, atmosphere and people of India and Sri Lanka. Subject matter which he still pursues to this day when he accompanies and mentors groups of artists to these exotic places.

His success as a painter has been celebrated through many one man shows in London Galleries and he has exhibited at the Royal Watercolour Society, the Royal Institute of Painters in Watercolour and the Royal Academy Summer Exhibition to name but a few. An established and time-honoured career path one might think, but this would set Charles nodding in agreement as he steeps himself in the traditional values and the real craft of painting and drawing. His watercolours are influenced by studying Turner and Cotman, his oils influenced by the works of Constable and Cezanne. Add into the mix his own heightened awareness of colour and love of 'plein air' painting and you'll understand why his works feature in so many private collections. ### **Derek's Cup**

Big announcement, hot off the press. Nancy Kyte is going to give a new cup to Bremhill village show in memory of her husband Derek, who recently passed away. Derek was an amazing gardener who was especially good at growing vegetables. The quality and size of his onions were even praised at his memorial service! Find out about what this cup will be awarded for, and who will be the first winner when you come along to the Show.

The school holidays start at the end of the month and it is great when children get involved by entering the show. They do not need to enter just the children's classes, they can enter any class. Last year we had some brilliant art work and also show-stopping cakes.

### **SWISS ROLL RECIPE**

(For Bremhill Produce Show maybe?)

This recipe has been taken from my school exercise book - I wrote it for my homework in about 1966! It is very detailed, and makes quite amusing reading. You will have to change the weights and oven temperature into metric if you wish!

- 2 eggs
- 2 oz self-raising flour
- 3 oz caster sugar
- If chocolate flavoured, replace ½ ounce flour with cocoa

Put the oven on at Mark 6 (425F). Grease a Swiss roll tin and put in greaseproof paper, slit the paper for about 1 inch in the corners, so that the Swiss roll will have square corners. Brush the greaseproof paper - sides, corners and bottom - with lard or cooking fat (for best results).

Break the eggs into a bowl and whisk slightly. Add the sugar (caster sugar is used because it is finer than granulated, so it mixes better). Whisk, standing the bowl over a saucepan of hot water - it introduces air and so makes the sponge light. Carry on mixing until it goes thick and paler in colour (fresh eggs are best because they whisk well because they have a lot of egg white). Take the hot water away and whisk until cool. The whisking is important because it makes the sponge light. Sift the flour and fold it in a little at a time with a metal spoon (do this gently so as not to let too much air out). If making chocolate Swiss roll, the flour and the cocoa should be sifted together several times previously to mix them and get rid of any streaks. When the flour has been folded in, the mixture should be a pourable consistency. Pour it into the tin, tilt the tin to let the mixture spread evenly. Put in the oven to cook for about 8 minutes. If it is cooked for too long, it goes crisp and won't roll properly. Have a piece of greaseproof paper ready, sprinkled with caster sugar, so the Swiss roll won't stick. If filling with jam and buttercream, spread the jam on now, then roll it up with another piece of greaseproof paper on the inside. To help start rolling the Swiss roll (which should be pliable) make a slight indentation about ¾ inch from the end. Roll from there. Make the butter icing and when quite cool, unroll the Swiss roll and spread it on.

### WELL-BEING FOR EVERY BODY

Consume foods that are cooling and light in calories - fresh fruits, vegetable juices, raw vital salads will nourish your body for summertime activities. Also, fruit are more than 80 percent water, so grapes, watermelon, cantaloupe, and honeydew are a tasty way to replenish fluids and boost your energy.

Get outdoors. Our county is beautiful and exploring the great outdoors can be a helpful distraction to the chore of exercising. Even quick bursts of activity that we may not consider exercise can be fun ways to get outdoors, enjoy the sunshine and squeeze in some exercise-time in the process. And don't forget about vitamin D which our bodies can get from sunlight.

Stay hydrated. It is very important, especially in the summer months. No matter where you go or what you do, bring water with you. Our bodies can mis-read being de-hydrated for being hungry, leading to over consumption and weight gain. Also, when travelling on planes or to higher altitudes in general, the amount of oxygen in the air decreases, equating to dryer air and reduced body hydration. This can leave you with unhealthy food cravings, headaches and poor body awareness from fatigue.

### "Paris Spring" by James Naughtie

Jim Naughtie, pronounced Nocte, to you and me. He is the Journalist and Broadcaster who is one of the presenters of the Today programme on Radio 4.

### PRIVATE HERBERT HENRY RUMMING

6<sup>th</sup> Battalion Wiltshire Regiment No 18391

Born at Wick, Hill, Bremhill in 1895, the son of Frederick William Rumming and Sarah Ann (née Gale).

Died Thursday 20th September 1917 aged 23 years at Hollebeke Chateau, Passchendaele, Belguim and is buried at Bedford House cemetery, pre-war Chateau Rosendal, plot number 25, Row c.

Early in 1917, the 6<sup>th</sup> (Service) Battalion of the Wiltshire regiment were in the line at Hebuterne, near Thiepval, moving to the Ypres salient in April. In June they took part in the successful attack on Messines Ridge, gaining all their objectives.

A period of trench warfare was followed by heavy fighting on the Passchendaele Ridge. On the 20<sup>th</sup> September they captured and held a position in front of Hollebeke Chateau. Casualties were heavy including Herbert Rumming and the battalion was reinforced by 25 officers and 350 other ranks of the Royal Wiltshire Yeomanry, who had been dismounted.

They became the 6<sup>th</sup> (Royal Wiltshire) Yeomanry) Battalion. This arrangement worked well as many of the men in both units came from the same towns and villages.

After leaving school Herbert was working as a Baker's assistant in the 1911 census still living at home at Wick Hill, where his father was described as a Cattleman. It appears that Herbert volunteered with the 6<sup>th</sup> Wiltshires in 1915 and had been in France and Belgium since the middle of 1915
