

Bremhill (or Bremble), a township, village and large parish, with the hamlets of Charlcutt, East Tytherton, Foxham and Wick, 2½ miles north-west from Calne, and 4 east from Chippenham in Chippenham Hundred, Calne Union and within 4 miles of the station of the Great Western Railway. The church dedicated to St. Martin is in the Early English style; the benefice is an endowed vicarage, in the patronage of the Bishop, the Diocese of Salisbury, archdeaconry of Wilts., and deanery of Avebury. The incumbent is the Rev. Henry Drury, M.A., vicar. Here are chapels for the Primitive and Wesleyan Methodists. Also a Moravian settlement at East Tytherton. The Berks and Wilts canal runs through the parish. Population in 1851, was 1,421; acres 5,920.

Foxham is a chapelry, 3 miles north, the duties of which are voluntarily supplied by the vicar of Bremhill. Stanley, Hazeland, Wick, Cadenham, Spirthill, and Hanger, are other places
