

Rev Bowles Address to Chippenham Agrícultural Association.

The Rev Canon Bowles addressed the meeting. He said, "As a clergyman of a neighbouring parish for 33 years, I beg leave to give my testimony to the character of one of my parishioners, Thomas Summers, to who it is proposed to give a premium for faithful servitude..."
