The inhabitants of the little hamlet of Foxham, in the parish of Bremhill, have long experienced the munificence of the Marquis and Marchioness of Lansdowne, at whose expense, within the past year, a school room has been erected, in which 76 children during the week, and about 120 on Sundays, receive instruction.

Rewards have been frequently distributed, and on New Year's Day and again on Monday last, the day of her Majesty's marriage, her Ladyship sent the children presents of cakes, oranges and money.
