1833

... Jacob Waite, Henry Fry, and Robert Fry, all of Brinkworth, and Robert Jacob of Alderbury, for three months each... for breaches of the game laws.

1839

For Trial Charles Dixon, charged with having stolen a tail board to a waggon, the property of Abraham Young at Brinkworth Devizes & Wiltshire Gazette, 28 February 1839

Committed to the New Prison Devizes. Edward Brown, for two months, for destroying game at Brinkworth. Wiltshire Independent, 28 November 1839

Committed for Trial. Henry Smith, charged with having stolen one bushel of potatoes, the property of Edward Walker, at Brinkworth. Wiltshire Independent, 28 November 1839

1841

Committed to the New Prison Devizes. Mary Smith, for one month for willfully damaging the property of Edith Bishop, at Brinkworth.

Mary Smith, for one month for willfully damaging the Devizes and Wiltshire Gazette, 11 February 1841

Committed to the New Prison Devizes Richard Selwood, for two months, for maliciously cutting hair from the tails of two horses, the property of Robert Smith at Brinkworth.
