In the name of God amen I Henry Waite of Grittenham in the pische of Brinckworth in the Countie of Wiltes yeoman though weake in bodie yet of a good and perfecte memory thankes be to god therefore Doe here make and ordaine this my last will and testamt in manner and forme following Vizt. Imprimis I .... my Soule into the hands of Almighty god my maker and to Jesus Christ my loving Saviour and redeemer by and through whome I hope perfectlie to be Saved Item I commend my bodie to the earth from whence it came there to be buried in Christian buriall Item I give and bequeath to my brother Richard Waite of Cleverton in the pische of the Lea in the County aforesaid the Some of twentie poundes of Currant mony of England to be paied unto him within a yeare and a day after my decease Item I give and bequeath to Henry Waite the Sonne of John deceased beinge my godsonne the..... and perfecte some of five poundes of currant mony of England to be paied unto him within a yeare and a day after my decease Item I give to Edward Waite sonne of Edward Waite of Dauntsey the perfecte some of five poundes of currant mony of England to be paied unto him within a yeare and a day after my decease Item I give to Marie Hiscockes daughter of Alice of Brinckworth the some of ffiftie shillings of currant mony of England to be paid in manner and forme as aforesaid Item I give to Margaret Mathews wife of Hugh of Brinckworth twentie shillings of currant mony of England to be delivered and paied unto her, her selfe and to use other att my buriall Item I give unto Anne Pynnell and Joane Pynnell my Maide Servants the .... some of twentie shillings the .... some of twentie shillings of currant mony of England to be paied unto them within a yeare and a day after my decease Item I give to Robert Vines John Vines Henry Pinnell and Humfrey Pinnegar a noble apeece of currant mony of England to be paied unto them the daie of my buriall Item i give and bequeath all the rest of my goodes and Chattells moveable and unmoveable Elizabeth Waite my Wife whome I make my sole and alone Executrix of this my last will and testament Item I constitute ordaine and make Edward Waite of Dauntsey and Richard Waite of Clendon my loving Brothers the Overseers of this my last will and testament to see the same to be truly and faithfullie performed and doe paie to them for their paines ..... twentie shillings apeece of currant mony of England to be paied at the day of my buriall Signed *Henry Waite* Signed and Sealed in the presence of us *Thomas Harte John Clewett (?)*
