named fortune to Dye and departe this Life before they or either of them shall come or Attaine to perfect Age That then his or their Portion soe dyeinge shall Remaine and belonge unto the Survivors and Survivor Item I give and bequeath unto the poore aged People of Brinkworth fower Poundes to be distributed among them att the discretion of my Executors and the Overseers of the Poore of Brinkworth within One Moneth next after my Decease Item I give and bequeath unto my now dwelling Servant Tenne shillings to bee paied to her within one Moneth after my Decease And finally All the Rest of my goodes and Chattles not before by mee given nor bequeathed my Legacyes paied and my funerall Expences ..... My Will is that my Sonne Nicholas Pantinge And my sonne John Pantinge shall have Equally devided betwixt them whom also I Ordaine Joint Executors of this my last Will and Testament And Lastly I Ordaine and make my Wellbeloved Kinsmen William Hendley and Alexander Hendly Overseers of this my last Will and Testament desireinge them to see every thinge herein Expressed to bee performed and Done And for their Paynes Takeinge herein I give unto each of them Twelve pence apiece And I Doe hereby Disclayme All other and former Wills and Testament before by mee made Witnesses *Johw Sherer* ......
