Memorandum That William Beale of Brinckworth in the countie of Wiltes yeoman being sicke and weake in bodie but of perfect minde and memorie intending to make his last will and testament and setting about the same did make and declare his will nuncupative in these words following ffirst I bequeath my soule into the hands of my Savior and my bodie to be buried in the Churchyard of Brinckworth Secondly I give unto each (?) one of my children one sheepe a peece and to be delivered unto them by Margarett my whome I constitute ordeine and make my full and whole Executrix of this my last will and testaments all my goods chattells and moveables and the said William Beale did pronounce the said nuncupative will on or aboute the sixteenth daie of January last past in his then dwellinge house in Brinckworth aforesaid and did then and there request Ralph Ody and Esther Wheeler to beare witness that the same was his last will and testament In Wittness whereof wee have hereunto subscribed our names Ralph Ody Testis Thomas Lewen Esther Wheeler her marke
