Tollhouse on Harnham Bridge now called Ayleswade Bridge

List of tolls in 1413:

For any kind of wagon carrying goods or merchandise for sale, one half penny.

For every quarter of grain and rye for sale, one farthing.

For every two quarters of beans, peas, malt, oats, and salt for sale, one farthing.

For each horse, mare, ox, cow and calf for sale, one halfpenny.

For every 10 sheep, goats, pigs for sale, one penny.

For any consignment of bread, garlic, onions and fish for sale, one halfpenny.

For any tun (252 gallons) of wine for sale, one penny.

For any pipe (126 gallons) of wine for sale, one halfpenny

And for all other merchandise and goods for sale not here specified, conveyed across the foresaid bridge (apart from wool, leather and sheepskin) one penny per £1, one halfpenny per 10s, one farthing per 5s.

To give you an idea of money value - wages for a weaver would be 4 pennies a day, at that time.
