This is the last Will and Testament of me Robert Strange of Broad Blunsdon in the Parish of Highworth in the County of Wilts Yeoman as follows I direct that all my just debts ffuneral expences and Testamentary charges shall be in the first place fully satisfied and paid as to my Messuage or Tenement ffarm and Lands with the Appurtenances as Broad Blunsdon aforesaid late the Estate of my Brother in Law Robert Hatcher deceased and of which by suffering a recovery thereof I am now become seized fee simple I give and devise the same unto and to the use of my friend Mary Brown of Broad Blunsdon aforesaid Spinster and her assigns for and during the term of her natural life without impeachment of waste and from and immediatly after her decease I give and devise the said Estate and Premises unto and to the use of Richard Benjamin otherwise Baingle his heirs and assigns for ever which said Robert Benjamin otherwise Baingle is the eldest son of Robert Benjamin otherwise Baingle of the Parish of Cricklade Saint Sampson in the said County of Wilts Labourer also I give and devise my ffreehold Messuage or Tenement and Premises situate in Chelworth in the Parish of Cricklade Saint Sampson in the occupation of the said Robert Benjamin otherwise Baingle unto and to the use of William Benjamin otherwise Baingle his heirs and assigns for ever which said William Benjamin otherwise Baingle is another son of the said Robert Benjamin otherwise Baingle and as to all other my Estates Messuages Lands Tenements and whatsoever and wheresoever I give and devise the same and every part thereof respectively unto and to the use of the

said Mary Brown her heirs and assigns for ever also I give and bequeath unto the said Mary Brown absolutely money and Personal Estate of every description and appoint her to be the Executrix of this my Will and lastly I do hereby revoke all my former Wills In Testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and Seal this fourteenth day of february in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighteen _ *Robert Strainge*
