

Post Office Directory Extract 1855 Broad Chalke



Broad Chalke is a township, parish and village, 8 miles south-west from Salisbury and 103 from London, and is in the Hundred of Chalke, Wilton Union, Salisbury bishopric, South Wilts. The church, which is well worthy of notice, is dedicated to All Saints; it is in the old English style, and has been completely renovated through the means of the Pembroke family, Dean and Rural Dean of Sarum, and the Rev. Abel Chapman, the curate. The living is a vicarage, value £300, in the gift of King's College, Cambridge; the Rev. Steven H. Hawtrey, MA, is the incumbent. Population, 821: acreage, 6,904. The river Ebble runs through.

Knighton and Stoke Farthing are hamlets 1 mile east; Mousehole, Guston & Little London, 1 mile west; Stowford Water, 1½ miles west; Stoke Pening 1½ miles north; Blueburg Bottom, 1 mile north-west. On the downs there is a barrow.

Fifield Bavant is a parish in the Chalke Hundred and Wilton Union, 1 mile west. The church, which is small, is dedicated to St Martin. Rev. William Taprell Allen, B.A. is curate. The population is 42; the acreage 1,145.
