COLLINS, FRANK PHILIP - Private 5567296 - 2nd Battalion Wiltshire Regiment - Died 23rd May 1940 - Age 27 - Son of Mrs. H. Carter of Broad Chalke - Commemorated on the Dunkirk Memorial, Nord, France - Grave/Memorial Reference - Column 118.

GOODRIDGE, ERIC SIDNEY - Sergeant (Air Gunner) 1153626 - 12 Squadron Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve - Died 20th February 1944 - Age 24 - Son of Bessie Goodridge of Broad Chalke - Buried at Harderwijk General Cemetery, Gelderland, Netherlands - Grave/Memorial Reference - British Plot 1. Grave 54.

SAUNDERS, AUBREY WILLIAM - Petty Officer P/SSX15620 - Royal Navy - Died 22nd May 1941 aboard H.M.S. Greyhound which was bombed and sunk off the Island of Antikithera in the Mediterranean while preventing an Italian convoy from passing between Greece and Crete - Age 24 - Son of Henry and Edith Emma Saunders of Bishopstone; Aubrey Saunders was mentioned in Despatches - Commemorated on the Portsmouth Naval Memorial, The Esplanade, Southsea, Portsmouth, Hampshire - Grave/Memorial Reference - Panel 46. Column 2.

STACEY, EDWARD CHARLES - Gunner 14299685 - 59 (6th Battalion Hampshire Regiment) Anti-Tank Regiment, Royal Artillery - Died 10th July 1944 - Age 20 - Son of George Harry and Ellen Stacey of Broad Chalke - Buried at Banneville-La-Campagne War Cemetery, Calvados, France - Grave/Memorial Reference - X. E. 10.
