Broad Hinton



Broad Hinton is a parish and village within Cricklade parliamentary borough, in the Northern division of the county, Marlborough union and county court district, diocese of Salisbury, archdeaconry of Wilts, and rural deanery of Avebury, partly in the hundred of Silkley, and partly in Kingsbridge, 4 miles south-east from Wootton Bassett, 6¹/₂ south-west from Swindon, and 89 from London, surrounded for many miles by open downs.

The church of St. Peter is an old stone building, having chancel, nave, aisles and square embattled tower containing 6 bells and porch. The interior was repaired about 1850. The living is a vicarage, yearly value £400, with residence and 3 acres of glebe, in the patronage of the Master of St. Nicholas Hospital, Salisbury, and held by the Rev. Vyell Donnithorne Vyvyan, of St. John's College, Cambridge, and St. Aiden's College, Birkenhead.

There are two schools, one of which is endowed with £20 per annum by the late lord of the manor, Thomas Henet, esq. In this parish are several very excellent charities. One, called Smith's charity, amounting to £18 per annum, distributed in clothing and bedding; also an apprentice fund, amounting to £14 per annum.

The trustees of Sir Henry Meux, bart., are lords of the manor and principal landowners.

The soil is black mould; subsoil, white stone. The chief crops are wheat, oats and turnips.

The area is 3,659 acres, and the population in 1871 was 413.
