- 1. Some doubt whether he was vicar or incumbent of another Hinton in the Diocese.
- 2. Part of the Diocesan Register 1474-1478 is lost, but Thomas Mathew was recorded as the previous Vicar on the installation of Johannes Davy.
- 3. Afterwards Sir V. D. Vyvyan, Bart, Rector of Withiel.
- 4. Canon Keith Hamilton Lamden was priest in charge, Paul Bradish was curate.

The church was probably at an early period appropriated to the See of Sarum, and the advowson, or right of presentation of a Vicar was subsequently granted out to Richard de Hinton, or one of his predecessors. In 1248 the Bishop granted the great tithes to the Hospital of St. Nicholas, Salisbury, by which means the hospital became the appropriator, while the advowson still remained in the hands of the former grantee, or his successor, until granted by Richard de Hinton to the Hospital in 1253. However, the Bishop presented to the Vicarage until 1478.

The Church was originally dedicated to the Virgin Mary, changing the St. Peter ad Vincula in the late nineteenth century, probably at the time of the 1879 restoration
