Bromham 1800-1849

1828

At Wilts Sessions, held at Salisbury, before the Earl of Radnor, chairman, and a numerous bench of magistrates, the following prisoners were tried, and sentenced as follows: Transportation - Seven years: Joseph Myers, for stealing a piece of printed cotton from the shop of James Blackman at Bromham. **Bath Chronicle and Western Gazette, 24 April 1828**

1835

Committed to House of Correction, Devizes. Alexander Gardener, for twenty days, and Stephen Dyke, for ten days, for stealing apples, from the orchard of Mr Gaby, of Bromham. **Devizes and Wiltshire Gazette, 3 September 1835**

1839

Committed for Trial. Isaac Webb, charged with having stolen a quantity of potatoes, the property of Elizabeth Shalter, at Bromham. **Wiltshire Independent 28 November 1839**

1843

Wilts Epiphany Sessions Rachael Boodle, charged with having stolen five blocks of wood, the property of Joseph Davis, at Bromham. Guilty: 6 months imprisonment. **Wiltshire Independent, 12 January 1843**
