Inquest on Unnamed Baby

Baby Killed

Explosives in Coal?

At an inquest at Bromham, Wiltshire, on a baby it was stated that the child was killed by an explosion that occurred when coal was put on the kitchen fire.

The child's father suggested that coal was being produced so quickly nowadays that explosive charges might be overlooked.

The coroner said that might be the case and the jury in returning an open verdict added a rider that attention of the coal authorities should be drawn to the case.
